Programme Overview

On **05 August 2021**, the **Eco-Schools Workshop 2** has been successfully hosted by the **Kedah Eco-Schools Programme** through an online platform with 34 representatives from 8 schools. It is a continuation of the last seminar, discussing several key topics: **Environmental Review, Handling Process for Step 2, Tour Excel File**. A reminder on the **Audit Form** and **Eco-Schools Manual Submission** was also included in the workshop to ensure that all schools have returned theirs before moving on to the next step. This workshop is conducted to help the participants gain a better understanding of what they should do next after completing Step 1. Now that it has gone into a deeper explanation of the Eco-Schools process, this workshop mainly focuses on teaching the participants where and how they should start working on Step 2. However, it does not fully cover the whole Step 2 process as other workshops and meet-ups will be conducted to explain further.

TOPICS DISCUSSED

1. Introduction by Mr Sri

Mr Sri, the Programme Director, opened the session by welcoming participants and visitors and briefly describing the programme topics. Following a brief introduction, a reminder was given to all participating schools regarding their submission of the Eco-Schools Audit Form as well as the addresses for the posting of the Eco-Schools Manuals.

2. Environmental Review

A session was conducted, led by Mr Sri, to demonstrate the process of the Eco-Schools Environmental Review. The session emphasised the Eco-Schools 12 themes whereby each theme will have to be reviewed by the schools in order to determine which themes are experiencing a deficiency.

3. Eco-Schools Methodology - Step 2 Process

The topic focuses on teachers' responsibilities to assist students in answering their scorecards by informing them about the school's performance. It will be based on the 12 Eco-Schools themes, as well as communication. After completing the scorecard, they will be required to upload the data into an Excel file in order to determine the three (3) critical themes that should be prioritised. To ensure that the procedure proceeded well for the students, the participants were also notified about the revised version of the form.

5. Environmental Review Forms (Excel and Word File Tour)

Mr Sri has showed how to fill out the Environmental Review form from Part 1 to Part 3 to assist the representatives understand how it works. After answering all questions, he demonstrated how the data should be moved to the Excel file before determining how to select the 3 critical themes.

6. Announcement

At the end of the workshop, participants were reminded once again to submit their Eco-Schools Manual as soon as possible. They were also informed that there will be a Google Sites Workshop in the next 2 weeks, in which the teachers especially are required to attend to learn how to use Google Sites for dissemination. Before ending the session, the e-attendance was distributed through link sharing in the chat box for the participants to fill in as evidence that they have attended the seminar.

RECEPTION OF PARTICIPANTS

Eight registered schools under Eco-Schools Kedah were represented. The attendance list could be found on **page 4 and 5** of this programme report. Overall, the workshop received positive feedback from the participants, which include the teachers and students. The participants gave great cooperation throughout the workshop, which can be seen when they listened attentively to the presentation and unmuted only when necessary. Several of them asked questions at the end of the workshop to ensure that they are understanding things correctly. With the interest and cooperation that they give, the programme is expected to be conducted as planned.

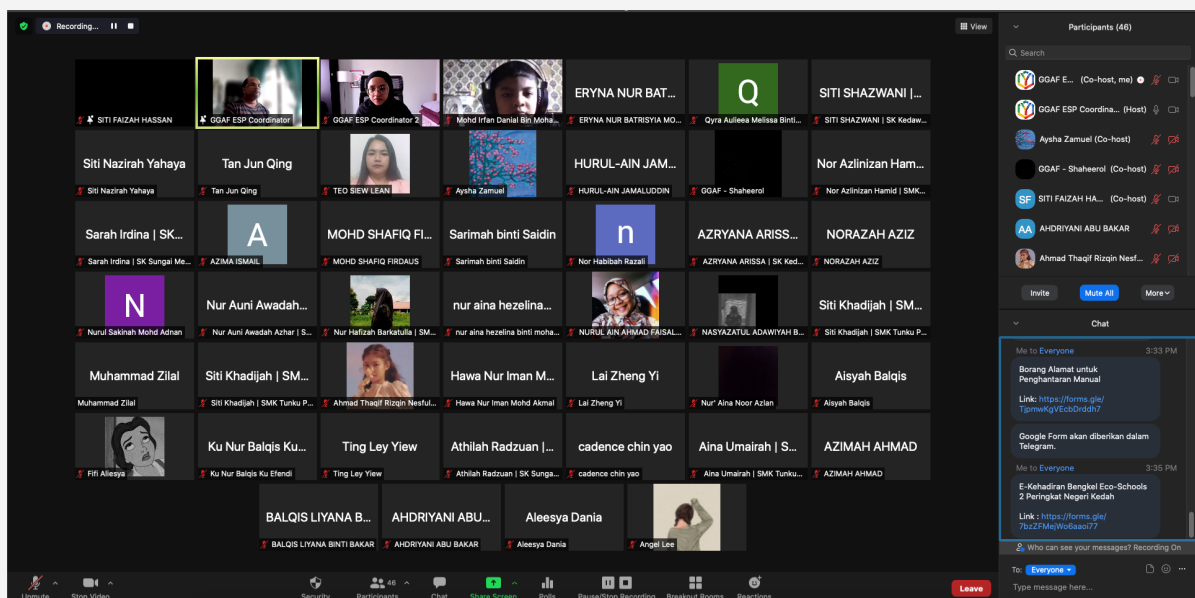
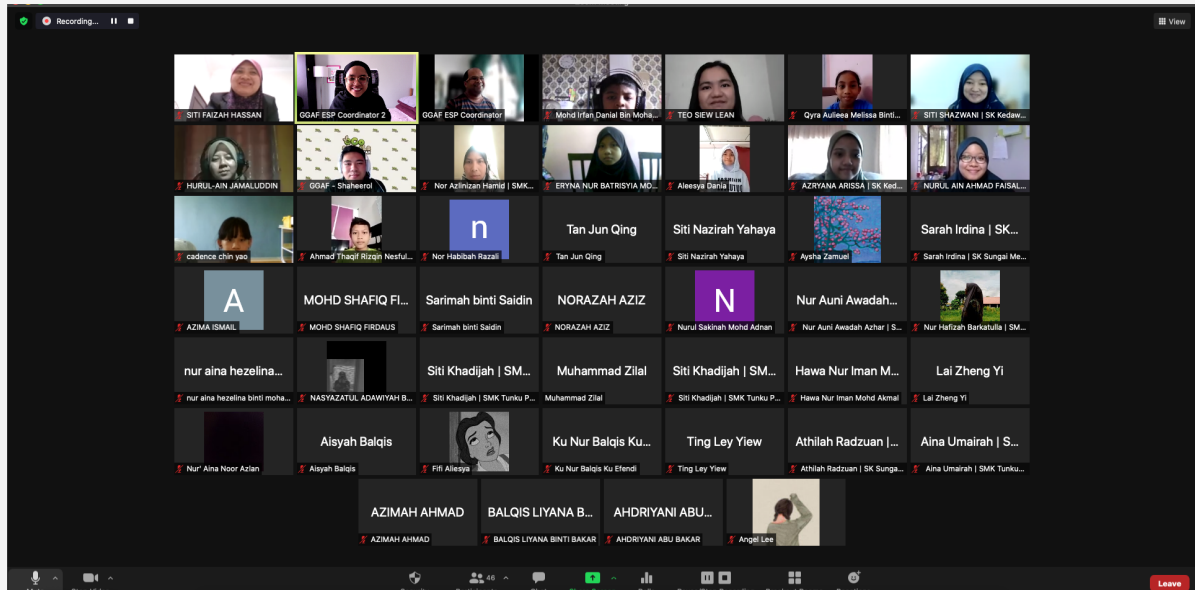
MOVING FORWARD

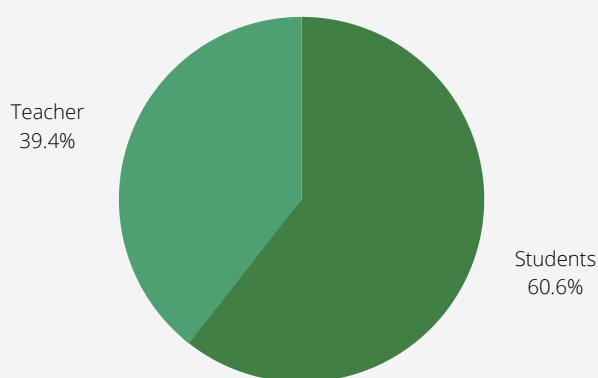

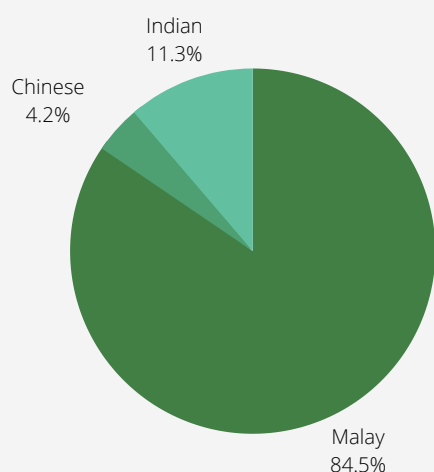
